

## Report for NMSHSA 2021-2022

The National Migrant and Seasonal Head Start Association (NMSHSA) advocates for Migrant and Seasonal Head Start (MSHS) programs that serve over 30,000 children across 34 states.

Over the course of the past year, NMSHSA has continued to carry out its mission of providing quality, comprehensive services to its MSHS families through meetings, focus groups, conferences, projects, programs, and more.

### MSHS Vaccine Clinics



Some of NMSHSA's key accomplishments include:

- **Vaccine Project (*Campesinos Apoyando Campesinos*)** - In partnership with NORC at the University of Chicago to help keep our essential workers protected from COVID-19
  - **Gained support from Legislative Leaders** - 36 members of congress signed a letter helping us acquire vaccines for our vaccine project
- **2022 Annual Public Policy Forum** - 41 hill meetings throughout June 2022
- **Meetings with Capital Leaders** - Executive Director, Cleofas Rodriguez, Jr., met with HHS Secretary, Xavier Becerra
  - **Farmworker Round Table** - Executive Director, Cleofas Rodriguez, Jr., met with other leaders of farmworker organizations to discuss the importance of the Farm Workforce Modernization Act
- **Healing Voices** - A partnership with the Eva Longoria Foundation, Justice for Migrant Women, and Latinx Therapy, that curated 8 support groups that underwent an 8 week program providing mental health aid to farmworkers across the states of Florida and California
