

Are Head Start locations transit accessible?

Transit is the #1 barrier to retention and enrollment in Head Start.

Civic Mapping Initiative will publish a series of state and federal **Head Start Transit Maps** highlighting the opportunities for improving access in 2023.





Only 40% of Head Start locations are within walking distance of transit.

An additional 30% of locations are less than five miles from transit, but too far to walk while carrying a toddler.





How can we improve transit access for families and staff?



Head Start providers can...

Assemble background information, notably Center hours of operation, routes used by families and staff.

Meet with transit agencies to share needs and priorities. Consider transit access, engage transit agency prior to new site selection.



Review the Head Start locations to identify possible route changes, demand service adjustments.

Meet with Head Start providers to learn how families and staff interact with transit, core needs for routes, schedules, stops.

Identifying opportunities for adjustments (e.g., changes of less than half a mile), connecting with local counterparts


25% of Michigan's Head Start Centers are less than one mile away from a bus stop – but still beyond "walking distance" for a young child.

Modest location changes for these **173 bus stops** offer Michigan a lowcost opportunity to ease Head Start enrollment, address attrition, and enable employee retention.




Michigan currently has 698* Head Start Center

Many Head Start Centers are colocated with other points of interest, like elementary schools, which would benefit from easier transit access.

In the Lansing area, there are four Head Starts co-located with MSU and/or elementary schools with bus stops just beyond walking distance.
